3. **Course taught in English:**

Undergraduate level June 4 to June 29, 2018
- Purchasing Logistics with a Global Perspective 10 ECTS credits

The aim of this course is to give advanced knowledge of logistics in purchasing and supply chain management with a global perspective. The focus is on the purchasing functions importance for the company result. The course includes the following elements:

- Purchasing and strategic sourcing
- Supply chain management, Globalization and Incoterms
- Initiate supplier relations: define needs, specify and document
- Assess supplier portfolio, select suppliers
- Prepare negotiations with regard to TCO and cost break-down
- Legal aspects, contracts, delivery and payment terms and contract management
- Supplier relations, Systems for managing supplier relationships (SRM)
- Sustainability and Corporate social responsibility (CSR)
- Purchase orders, performance measurements (KPIs), and supplier evaluation
- Supplier development process
- Terminate supplier relations

Prerequisites:

- 1.- One year of undergraduate level studies in Engineering and/or Management
- 2.- Fluency in English equivalent to at least 575 (paper based) or 90 (internet based) TOEFL score. For English language proficiency waiver, please see www.ju.se/summerschool

4. Cost:

Application fee: 900 SEK

Tuition undergraduate courses: 20 000 SEK per course

Social and Cultural package: 700 SEK (Includes welcome lunch, social activities, company visits, cultural trip, farewell dinner)

Housing cost for 4 weeks: 4000 SEK approx.

5. Housing:

Admitted students will receive a link to apply for accommodation.

-Double or single room accommodation off-campus. The kitchens and bathrooms are shared with other students.

-Housing alternatives include bed, bed quilt, pillow, wardrobe, access to laundry-room and kitchen including fridge. Fixed utility cost (electricity and water included). Some kitchen utilities may be left to use by previous students.

6. Dates:

Undergraduate courses (4 weeks)

Arrival and pick-up service*: **June 2 to 3, 2018**

Course and activities included in the program: **June 4 to June 29, 2018.**

Students are expected to participate from the first day until the last day of the courses.

Housing dates: students will have access to the accommodation from June 2 to June 30, 2018.

**Pick-up service is offered to all students arriving during the arrival dates and who register their arrival information by the determined deadline.*

7. Application Procedure:

2.- Application Deadline: **April 1, 2018.**

Visa requirements

Please note that citizens of certain countries do not require a visa to enter Sweden if staying shorter than 3 months. 8. **Medical insurance:** The medical/health insurance is not included. Students are recommended to buy a health insurance before coming to Sweden.

9. **Clothing:** It is summer time in Sweden, which means students should bring summer clothes. However, some days can be fresh in Sweden, so a light jacket is recommended. The dressing attire during classes is informal. For the company visit and special events, students should bring clothes for the occasion.
